Progression to industry

With our strong focus on employability, Brunel is proud to have one of the highest graduate starting salaries in the UK. Over 90 per cent of our undergraduates and postgraduates are in work or further education six months after graduating.

Most of our undergraduate courses offer the one year 'thick sandwich' or placement year. We have found that undergraduate students who did the placements were five per cent more likely to be employed and their starting salary was an average of £3,720 higher.
